

Julie A. Whitmore Announced 2018 New Hampshire Young Engineer of the Year

Bedford, NH – Julie Whitmore P.E., has been selected by a jury of her peers from New Hampshire's Joint Engineering Societies as the 2018 New Hampshire Young Engineer of the Year. This distinguished award will be presented to Julie on February 22nd at the annual Engineers' Week Awards Banquet at Grappone Conference Center, in Concord, NH.

Terracon, in partnership with VHB, submitted a nomination based on her engineering accomplishments, and state and national record of service to the profession. Julie is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire where she received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering (2006). She maintains professional licensure in New Hampshire and Maine. She is an active member of the National Society of Professional Engineers, where she serves as Secretary of the New Hampshire Chapter.

Julie is a well-rounded Professional Engineer who has spent the entirety of her 11-year career at VHB. She has a diverse skill set spanning structural design, highway engineering, and hydraulic modeling and analysis. She began her career with VHB's Highway group, then, after two years, transitioned to VHB's Structural team. Since that time, she has been responsible for progressively challenging assignments, seizing opportunities for leadership and mentoring junior staff members. More recently, she has begun managing her own projects, building trust with VHB's most valued clients in Northern New England.

As a rising leader in her industry, Julie has shared her knowledge of the engineering industry, presenting her work at two national-level conferences; including 2014 Precast/Prestressed Concrete Institute National Bridge Conference (PCI) Convention and National Bridge Conference, and 2017 National Accelerated Bridge Conference. Additionally, Julie is actively involved with University of New Hampshire's Engineering Capstone Program, which includes presenting and mentoring to 150 UNH students on her work in the industry. For the past four years, Julie has also served as a judge at the annual New Hampshire Science and Engineering Exposition.

Outside of serving the engineering profession, Julie also unites her personal interest in fitness with her commitment to charity causes. She routinely organizes and runs in the annual Cigna/Elliot Corporate 5K Road Race in Manchester, New Hampshire, to help raise money and awareness for the Elliot Regional Cancer Center, a longstanding oncological pioneer in the area. Julie has also been involved periodically with charity races to support Alzheimer's awareness and Easter Seals.
